Rashid Memorial Welfare Organization (RMWO) was set up by a group of retired PAF officers in 1998 in memory of Flt.Lt. Rashid Ahmed Khan, who embraced 'Shahadat' on 13th December, 1997 when his Aircraft caught fire above a densely populated area.

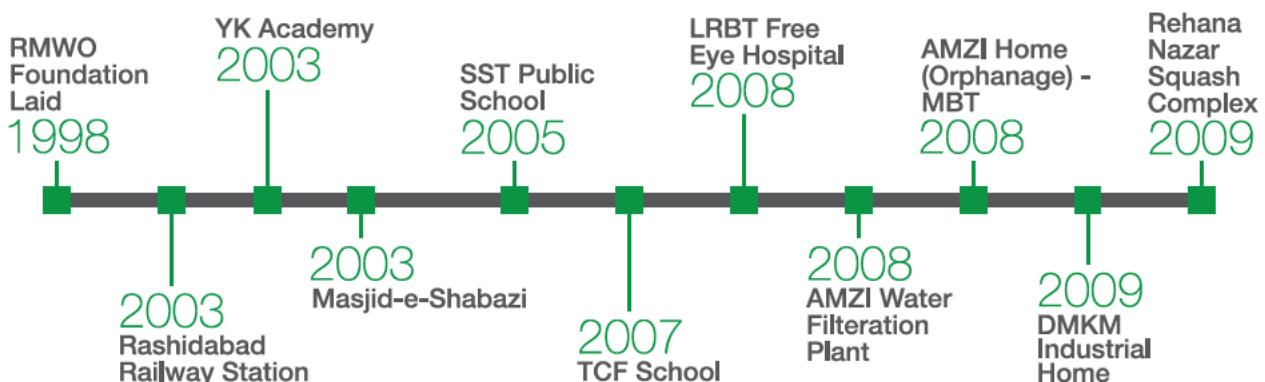

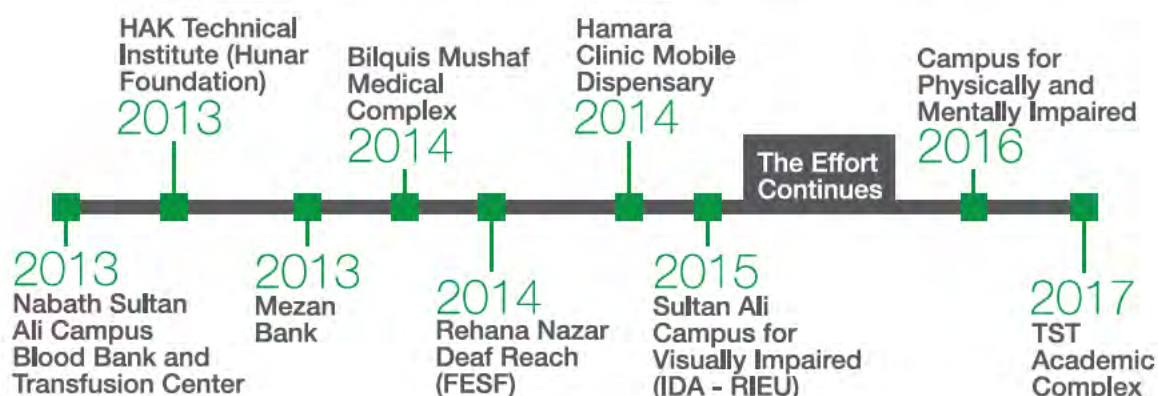

SST Public School

SST Public School is a venture of the Old Boys of PAF Public School Sargodha. Housing 500 boys it has all the facilities and faculty to allow development par excellence in all fields and not just the IGCSE/A level. 25% students (orphans & destitute) are on full scholarship representing the entire country - with the aim of achieving the National integration.

YK Academy

YK Academy is a day school catering to a diverse group of socio-economic strata for 900 boys & girls from kindergarten to matric level. Students belonging to families with good financial background pay full tuition fee. Those who cannot afford are provided free uniform, books, transportation and tuition fee.





The Citizens Foundation School

The Citizens Foundation School (Rubab Kassam Campus) is another enterprise which the Citizens Foundation helped establish for 900 students, boys & girls to impart quality education and training. It is one of the outstanding school of Citizens Foundation and the best in the region.

Hajiani Ashraf Khatoon Technical Institute

Operated by The Hunar Foundation (THF)

RMWO has spent over Rs.100 million on its building construction and handed over to THF for operation. THF has affiliated this institution with City & Guilds – UK, enabling the students to seek employment anywhere in the world.



THF is conducting training (12 months) in the field of:

General Electric, General Mechanics, Plumbing, Welding, Air Conditioning/ Refrigeration, Carpentry, Electronic servicing, Motor/Motor Cycle Mechanics and Tractor Workshop.



Rehana Nazar School for Hearing Impaired

The infrastructure has been built by RMWO costing Rs.100 million, while the operational responsibility has been taken over by Family Educational Services Foundation (FESF) with an induction of 125 deaf students. Khurram & Sameera (USA) sponsored the campus, hence named after their beloved mother Rehana Nazar. It has the capacity to educate 1000 deaf boys/girls, with a residential hostel for 100 girls. The campus would offer family accommodation for 11 faculty members.

Mr Shahnawaz (USA) sponsored the entire cost of the building in the name of his honorable father Mr Sultan Ali.

RMWO started the construction on 10th October 2013, and the campus got commissioned in October 2015.

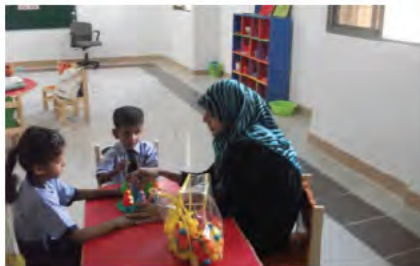
The campus has a residential capacity for 100 boys & girls each. It has been handed over to IDA-RIEU Welfare Association for operations.

Non Formal Schools

SUFFAH LITERACY in 10 villages in close proximity to Rashidabad has been in vogue since the past 8 years. This has specifically addressed the needs of the village females. All books at these schools are provided free to the students. It had been initiated by MBT, and also supported by NEDians Social Welfare Trust.

A project for non - school going children has also been launched under 'Fatima Literacy' in the basement of Masjid -e-Shabazi.

Deserving IDP students have been picked up from the northern areas by RMWO and inducted at YK Academy in October 2010. At the time of reporting they only knew their mother tongue. All of them have joined the main stream and a few have joined SST Public School on merit. More recently a batch of students have been picked up and inducted in Hunar Foundation for one year Tech Training.

DMKM Vocational Training Center

For specific skill development like sewing & stitching, knitting, local handicraft work etc. has been launched by the DMKM Welfare Fund at the basement of KHAWAJA YAQUB HOUSE.

A 200 bed Bilquis-Mushaf General Hospital was inaugurated by Air Chief Marshal Tahir Rafiq Butt CAS PAF on 20th February 2014. The facilities of Pathological lab, X-Ray, Peds & Gynae Operations and Dialysis Center (Zaheer Hassan) are currently extended to the rural under-privileged at subsidized cost. Efforts are underway to establish an ICU and Cardiac Centre.

I-Care Foundation, Rajby Trust and INFAQ Foundation are the main Donors for the operations.

LRBT Free Eye Hospital

A 50 bed Eye Hospital was constructed by RMWO (dedicated to Salim A Shaikh) at a cost of Rs 40 million and handed over to **Layton Rehmatullah Benevolent Trust (LRBT)** for operations. LRBT hospital was commissioned in June, 2008.

On an average over 400 outdoor patients are treated daily. In addition, over 50 eye operations are performed daily.

Blood Bank & Tranfusion Centre

An independent building Nabath Sultan Ali Centre, sponsored by Mr. Shahnawaz (USA), in the name of his beloved mother has been commissioned. It was inaugurated jointly by Nabath Sultan Ali & Lt.Gen. Moinuddin Haider on 23rd March 2013.

It is being run by **Fatmid Foundation**. Over 200 patients have been registered for regular blood transfusion (Thalassemia & Hemophilia).

Hamara Clinic & Mobile Dispensaries

4 mobile vans have been purchased to run in different directions within a radius of 15km of Rashidabad, carrying a doctor / dispenser and almost complete range of medicines. Each one makes a stop in 3 specified villages 6 days a week. Mobile clinics provide total OPD services at the door step of the rural population that cannot commute to the main city.

AMZI Home constructed at a cost of Rs.45 million is a magnificent purpose-built structure to house 288 orphans/destitute and 70 widows. This has been wholly built and managed by the 'Mustafa Benevolent Trust'.

It is a white structure mosque and can house up to 4,000 namazies at a time, including women to pray on the first floor. The basement (Hameeda Shafique Islamic Centre) is utilized to run Fatima Literacy School for non-school going children.



Batool Shah Microfinance

An interest free 'Batool Shah Microfinance' has been set up with a seed money of Rs.1.0 million.

Women completing 6 months training at DMKM vocational training centre are provided with SALIKA Sewing machines on easy installments.



AKHUWAT Foundation

AKHUWAT Foundation has recently approved the launch of an interest free microfinance project at Rashidabad.

AMZI Water Filtration Plant

A reverse Osmosis Plant with a capacity of 5000 gall/day has been set up by MBT to supply clean potable water to residents within Rashidabad.

The entire city is smoke-free & drug-free. To facilitate people, especially children, an artificial lake has been created to maintain balance with nature. A paddle and a rowing boat in the lake facilitates children to practice their rowing skills. Sports fields have been specially allocated to boost physical fitness of students at Rashidabad.



Rashidabad Railway Station

Constructed by RMWO for facilitating the patients, students and workers to avail the cheapest means for daily commuting.



ANJ Community Center

A community center dedicated to Ali Nawaz Jatoi has been commissioned to facilitate day to day needs of the occupants. An indoor club has also been commissioned on the 1st floor.



Meezan Bank

Meezan Bank has established a 'Smart Branch' at Rashidabad. It offers locker facility along with the ATM.



Rehana Nazar Squash Complex

Two squash courts are complete with wooden floors and glass doors of international standard. Entire funding was received from USA for this purpose and it was activated in August 2009. It has been named after their family as 'Rehana Nazar Squash Complex'. National Junior Squash Championships are held every year at the complex.

Projects Under Construction

Home of Peace

For Physically & Mentally Disadvantaged Children

One of the sectors desperately needed was the facility for the 'Physically & Mentally' disadvantaged children. DARUL-SUKUN an organization running these facilities on Kashmir Road Karachi offered to manage and operate the facility. RMWO has taken over the responsibility to construct /develop the building. The construction was launched in August 2015. It would house 250 special children, with 100 Senior Citizens, at an estimated cost of Rs. 250 million.



TST Academic Complex

This campus would be from Montessori to HSSC (boys and girls), and in addition house 'Zaigham' Professional Development Centre. Once completed, it would be taken over by the Old Boys' Association of P.A.F. Public School Lower Topa for operations.

RMWO has dedicated the last vacant plot of 4 acres for the Academic Campus. The drawings are being prepared gratis by Shahab Ghani & Associates. Construction (estimated at Rs. 250 million) is to be launched in December 2015, and expected to be commissioned by mid 2017 - InshaAllah.

Education Sector

1.

Set up an Academic complex up to college level, along with a Professional Development Center. Cost Rs.250 million.

2.

Establish a radio station for the sole purpose of spreading education.

3.

Increase the number of sponsored children.

Health Sector

Bilquis Mushaf General Hospital:

Optimum commissioning of BMMC General Hospital to capacity will mark the culmination of basic elements of the holistic facilities at Rashidabad and the beginning of positive change in large rural districts from Hyderabad to Chore and from Tando Mohammad Khan to Nawabshah. It requires nearly Rs.25 million to commission the entire hospital facilities. In addition to capital expenses, RMWO requires nearly Rs.25 million annually to sustain operations.

Zakat Sector

1.

General Hospital: Gynea, Paeds, Ortho, Dialysis & General Surgery for rural zakat deserving - Rs.25 million per year.

2.

Education: 100 destitute children. Annual expenses estimated at Rs.12 million per year, covering total expenses including travel, medical, boarding & messing, clothing and tuition.

3.

General: Provisioning of Ration – annual Rs.10 million for rural families.

Social Service

1.

Establish a Sarai with allied facilities for 100 women who accompany patients. Cost Rs.20 million.

2.

Construction of Home for the Physically & Mentally disadvantaged. Cost Rs.250 million.
