

FLIGHT LIEUTENANT YUNUS HUSSAIN (SHAHEED) SITARA-I-JURAT (SJ)

Flight Lieutenant **Yunus Hussain**

Fought in air battles aggressively, fearlessly and with great professional skill.

During one such engagement, he fought singly against six enemy aircraft and shot down two Hunter aircraft.

Though his own aircraft was damaged in this encounter, he managed to bring it back to Base safely.

On 6 September, 1965 while attacking Halwara airfield, his small formation was intercepted by a large number of enemy aircraft and, although his aircraft was hit, he refused to breakoff the engagement, in complete disregard of personal safety, and was reported missing from this mission.

He became a symbol of courage and professionalism for other pilots. For his valour, professional skill and devotion to duty he was awarded Sitara-i-Jurat (SJ).

BRIEF HISTORY OF RASHID MEMORIAL WELFARE ORGANIZATION

Rashid Memorial Welfare Organization (RMWO) was set up by a group of retired PAF Officers in 1998 in memory of Flight Lieutenant Rashid Ahmed Khan, who embraced 'Shahadat' on 13th December, 1997, when his aircraft caught fire above a densely populated area. In his bid to save thousands on land, he maneuvered his Mirage aircraft away from population, and in this effort sacrificed his own life. RMWO was set up in the same spirit to dedicate and give to others what is not ours and to help those who need it most.

Rashidabad a pilot project of RMWO, is located in Sindh, 30 KM from Hyderabad towards Mirpur Khas and is stretched over 100 acres. Foundation stone was laid on 13th December, 1998 by the then Governor Sindh Lt. Gen. (R) Moinuddin Haider. Rashidabad encompasses all four elements of a sustainable society: education, health, environment and socio-economics.

Allhamdolillah! The Project has been quietly serving the underprivileged for over a decade, enhancing the quality and capacity in the field of education, adult literacy, vocational training, healthcare, and female self-actualization and self-enfranchisement.

VISION

To provide healthcare and education to the underprivileged population of Pakistan

OUR MISSION

Focus on eliminating illiteracy and alleviating deprivation from the country through establishing projects at district level. RMWO encompasses four essential elements of progress which must be addressed to help the disadvantaged through a holistic approach:

- e Education
- e Health
- Environment
- Socio-Economic Uplift

OBJECTIVE

To setup model villages throughout the country, integrating all essential facilities in a well-knit mosaic so as to ensure positive and beneficial outflow to the needy folk – all under one roof.

HOW WE ACCOMPLISH

Rashidabad is a city of collaboration. RMWO's objectives are achieved by joining hands with experienced and credible welfare organization in their own field, to set up operations in Rashidabad. The municipal facilities are provided by RMWO whereas operational expenditures are borne by the operating organizations themselves.

YUNUSABAD

In consonance with the aims and objectives of RMWO, "to set up model villages

throughout the country". RMWO, in collaboration with and the support of the Pakistan Air Force, is now ready to launch a similar project in Baluchistan. The Project is located along the Samungli Road, Quetta (close to PAF Base Samungli) on an area of over 100 acres. The unveiling of this Project will be performed by Air Chief Marshal Tahir Rafique Butt, NI(M), TBt,, former Chief of the Air Staff, Pakistan Air Force on 30th September, 2016.

The Project is named 'YUNUSABAD' after the First Shaheed of the 1965 war, Flight Lieutenant Yunus Hussain, SJ.

In keeping with the objectives of Rashidabad, Yunusabad also aims to eliminate illiteracy and alleviate poverty in the rural areas of Baluchistan.

Following the mission objectives of RMWO, of establishing similar projects at district level in the country, Yunusabad, in Baluchistan also encompasses a holistic approach thus serving the essential elements of progress:

Education
Health
Environment
Socio-economic Uplift
Mational Cohesion
Vocational Training

Yunusabad aims to integrate the above elements thereby ensuring positive outflow to the needy under one roof.
